C0091 STATION ROAD, ROLLESTON ON DOVE.

Staffordshire County Council working with Amey Services Ltd with will shortly be carrying out major highway Improvement works along Station Road, Rolleston on Dove, between School Lane and near South Hill.

The works are the final part of a wider package of works that involved a major drainage and surface scheme in Beacon Road, and this will see a further investment of £600,000 in the local area to reconstruct the road.

The initial works will see the replacing of any damaged kerbs, replacement of footways where necessary, the upgrading of bus stop locations, the cleansing/replacement of any damaged drainage systems and attending to the ironwork. Following this, the resurfacing of the carriageway is due to commence in early December 2022.

Most of the proposed works will take place under temporary traffic signals allowing us to us to maintain a through route for vehicles with as little impact or inconvenience as possible. However, there may be a need to undertake a full closure during the works as the scheme progresses.

Works on Station Road will start around 19th September 2022 and will take approximately 22 weeks to complete, although you may see a presence on site prior to this date as we mobilise equipment and continue investigatory works.

Due to the nature and scale of the works being planned for December 2022 and January 2023, the road will need to be closed at times when these machines are in operation. In advance of these temporary closures, we will write to you again during late November 2022 to advise accordingly, but signs will be clearly placed to notify motorists of the time and date of these restrictions.

Both pedestrian and vehicular access to properties along the length of the scheme will be maintained throughout the works; however, there may be times of short restriction as we carry out these essential repairs outside each property. We will notify residents when work is due to take place outside their properties and will endeavour to make sure this causes the minimum of disruption.

Unfortunately, with any major highway works, some disturbance is unavoidable, and there may be short delays, so I must ask that you drive carefully and slowly through any sections of live roadworks for both the workforces and your own safety.

We apologise in advance for any inconvenience these works may create, however these measures are essential for us to make such improvements to this route, and we kindly ask for your patience during this time.
